At the first mention of snow in the forecast,
many of us can't help but think of Frosty the
Snowman. It's a cheerful children's song that
brings back memories of carefree winter days,
snow-covered yards, and the simple joy that
snow once held. When we were younger, snow
meant fun, adventure, and unexpected delight.

These days, I'll admit my fondness for snow isn't
quite the same. Now it often feels more like a
nuisance—especially when events are canceled
and plans are disrupted. Since I can't control the
weather (as much as I might like to), I decided to
look for a few positive attributes of snow
instead.

Snow can be a powerful symbol of purity and
forgiveness. It can serve as a visual reminder of
God's grace—covering, cleansing, and making all
things new. Snow also invites stillness and
reflection. I remember past winter storms and
how everything seemed to slow down. Maybe
those moments are an invitation for us to pause,
pray, and listen more closely for the voice of God.

Snow is also a gentle reminder that we are not in
charge. None of us controls the weather, and that
reality can highlight our human limits. It nudges
us away from self-reliance and toward trust,
patience, and a deeper relationship with God.

So perhaps instead of stressing over
unpredictable weather, we can embrace what
God is doing through creation. In its own way,
snow does what the church often tries to do: it
slows us down, humbles us, brings people
together, and reminds us that renewal can come
quietly—sometimes inconveniently, yet
beautifully. Maybe Jack Rollins, who wrote
Frosty the Snowman, was an accidental
theologian without even knowing it.

May we pause and reflect on God's mercy,
grace, and beauty—even when the weather
doesn't turn out the way we want.
And after all, snow angels are always fun.

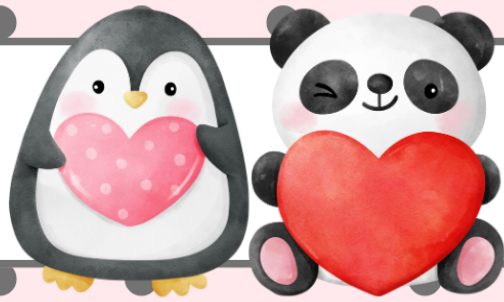

Defend the Fatherless began in 2016 when founder Caitlin Sund felt called to serve vulnerable children and families after spending time in an orphanage in China. What started as the York County Foster Closet has grown into a comprehensive ministry supporting foster and adoptive families.

Today, families receive essential items such as baby equipment, car seats, diapers, furniture, clothing, and gift cards. Through the Frozen Meal Program, families can also pick up a homemade meal during especially busy or challenging seasons. Beyond physical needs, Defend the Fatherless recognizes the emotional and spiritual toll of foster care and adoption. Parents, siblings, and children often experience trauma and benefit from counseling and community support.

Defend the Fatherless exists to meet the social, emotional, educational, spiritual, and financial needs of foster and adoptive families—walking alongside them with compassion, understanding, and hope.

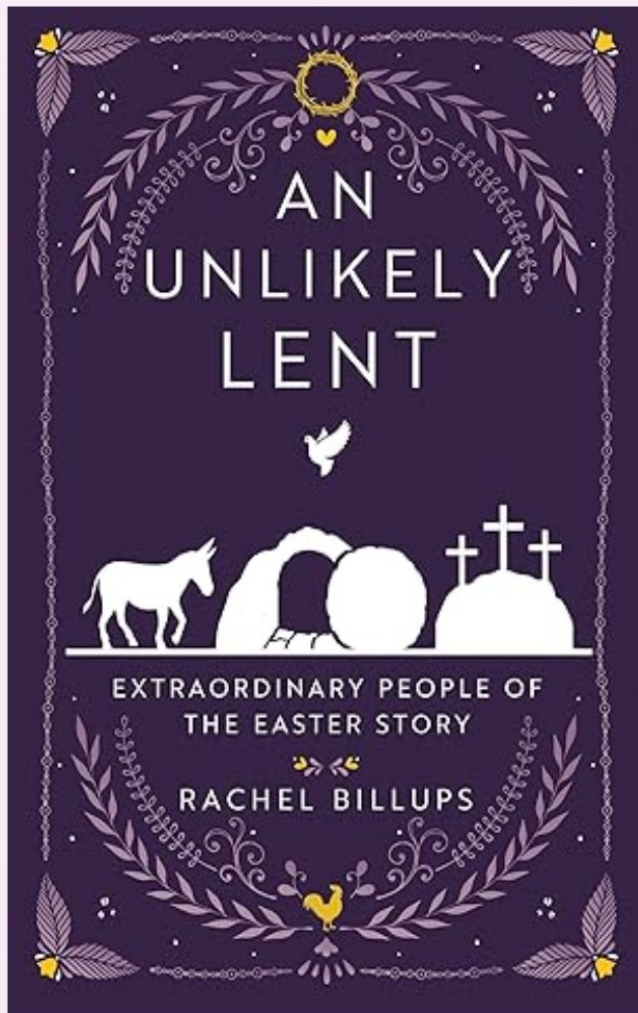

AN EXPANDING CIRCLE OF LOVE:

Growing up in Tennessee amid divorce, addiction, and mental health struggles, Brittney Conroy often found refuge with friends' families who welcomed her into their homes and churches. Watching foster families care for children planted a seed in her heart—one she didn't fully recognize until years later.

Today, Brittney and her husband Frank are the adoptive parents of four sisters they first welcomed as Epworth foster parents. Already raising three biological sons, the Conroys opened their home in 2020 to young sisters Gia and Renny, who had experienced trauma and developmental challenges. With patience, therapeutic support, and deep commitment, the girls began to thrive. Brittney and Frank also worked intentionally to keep sibling bonds strong, eventually welcoming the girls' older teenage sisters, Taalyiah and Monica, into their home as well.

After a difficult and uncertain season—including a brief reunification attempt—the children returned to the Conroys' care. In March of this year, the adoption of all four girls was finalized, marking a joyful milestone for the family.

Today, the Conroy home is full, lively, and thriving. Monica is attending the University of South Carolina, Taalyiah is preparing for college, and the younger children are flourishing in school and activities. Despite personal losses and ongoing challenges, Brittney and Frank see their journey as a calling—an extraordinary life shaped by faith, perseverance, and love.

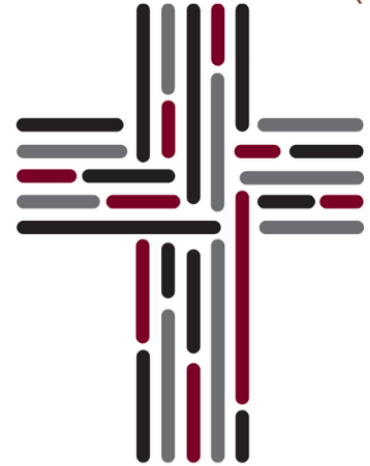
